FAMILY CASE MANAGEMENT

Case Management services, including home visits, are available to pregnant women, infants and children who meet financial and age eligibility. Family Case Management staff also provides services for high risk infants through the Illinois Perinatal Tracking program entitled Adverse Pregnancy Outcome Reporting System (APORS) and Medical Case Management for Department of Children and Family Services (DCFS) wards.

ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH PROGRAMS

The Clinton County Health Department inspects all retail food establishments, private sewage systems and private water wells within Clinton County.

The Clinton County Retail Food Ordinance was adopted December 1, 2002. Food Permit Fees are High Classification \$150.00, Medium Classification \$90.00 and Low Classification \$75, and Temporary Classification \$30.00. Food Permits are rated based on the most recent establishment's inspection score: Certified AA (100 - 97), Certified A (96 - 92), Certified (91 - 89) and Passed (87 -73). All food establishments are required to post their permit in plain view. Currently there are 38 High, 137 Medium and 41 Low Classification food establishments in Clinton County.

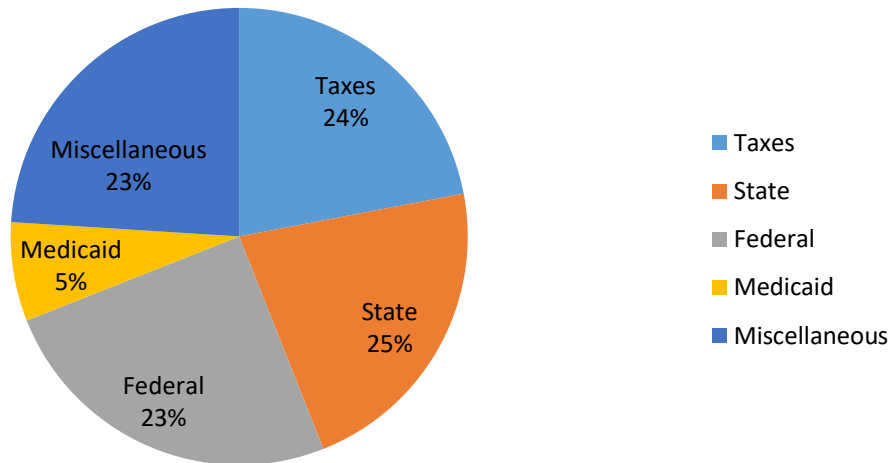
PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS 2018

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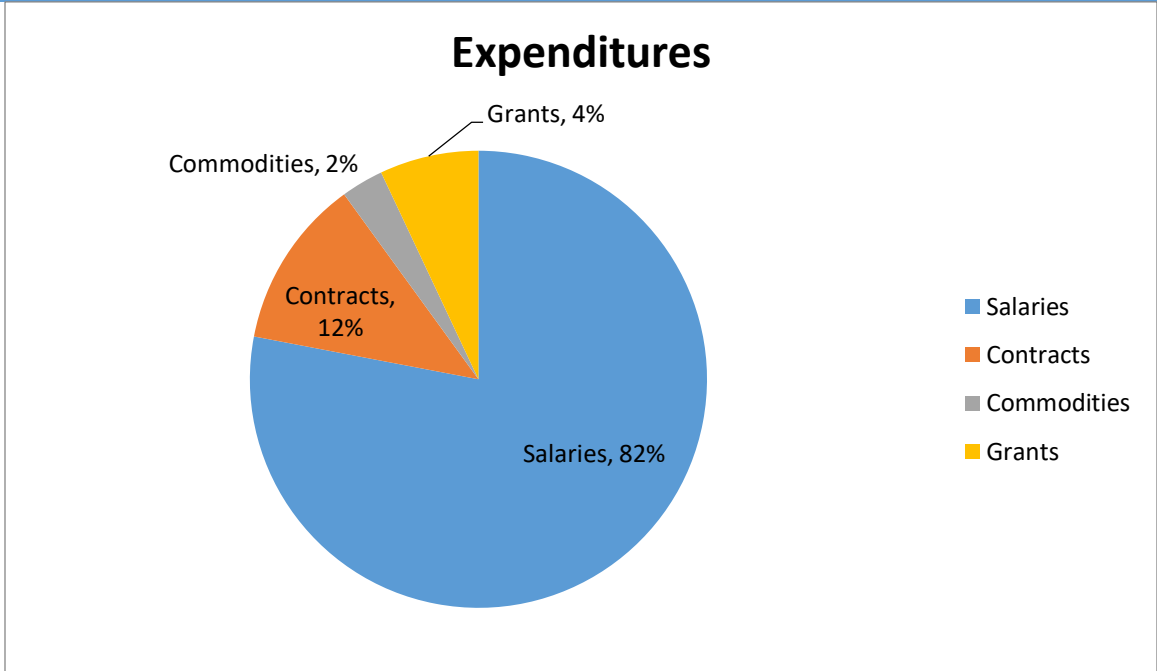
