FAMILY CASE MANAGEMENT

Case Management services, including home visits, are available to pregnant women, infants and children who meet financial and age eligibility. Family Case Management staff also provides services for high risk infants through the Illinois Perinatal Tracking program entitled Adverse Pregnancy Outcome Reporting System (APORS) and Medical Case Management for Department of Children and Family Services (DCFS) wards.





PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS 2022

Making sure the public is safe and ready for an emergency is a priority of the Clinton County Health Department. The Clinton County Health Department has an Emergency Preparedness and Response Program and oversees the Emergency Public Health Preparedness Activities, Cities Readiness Initiative and the Medical Reserve Corp. The Program works closely with community partners to address and prepare for emergencies and potential disasters. This has allowed our department to head the Contact Tracing and Mass Vaccinations efforts of Clinton County.
